In December 2009, Bible Way hosted a Town Hall meeting, providing an opportunity for the Bible Way church family to come together and ask questions about the church and the direction it is taking; particularly with our new mission, to know God, to love and to serve. It was a successful gathering and we were able to answer most questions posed that night by the congregation and online church family. As promised, we are posting the few remaining questions that were not able to be answered due to time constraints.

Q: *Can youth get involved with the Hospitality Ministry?*

A: Yes. The Hospitality Ministry has always involved youth. We encourage children and adults to have active volunteer careers both within their communities and here at the church. Q: *Why did they stop running the announcements during the offering?*

A: Due to time constraints of running the all of announcements during the offering, we now advertise announcements, upcoming events, employment opportunities, etc., on the widescreens before services, on the TV monitors in the vestibule of the church, in the church Administration Building, and at the Midlands Community Development Corporation's Dream Center. Additionally, announcements are posted on the homepage of our website, on the web calendar, and they are showcased on our online media player (before our live services begin). In response to your question, however, we are printing a few of the monthly calendars that are currently available on our website, and placing them in the vestibule.

Q: *As Bible Way continues to grow and increase, there will be a flux of people from every walk of life. I have a child with special needs, how can she become an active participant in the church especially in the youth ministry? Do we currently have a plan to implement youth with special needs into the current churches program?*

A: We provide reasonable accommodations for people with special needs and we are continuously working on meeting the needs of those with special needs. It is our desire to minister to all of our youth and we welcome any youth to be a part of the ministries we offer here at BWCAR; however, an assessment of the child's needs would have to be discussed in order to ensure the safety of the child and workers.
